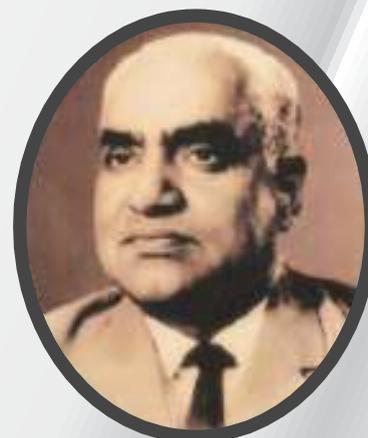

Rules for Admission

Migration Rule :

- Students who have passed lower examinations from other Boards/Universities except Punjab University, Punjabi University and P.S.E.B., will have to obtain eligibility certificate from GNDU on their own and submit the same along with lower case DMC and migration certificate within 15 days from the date of admission
- Provisional Admission: Students having compartment in 10+2 will be given provisional admission in the college. If the candidates fails to clear her compartment before first semester examination, her admission will be cancelled.
- No Migration from one college to another : No Student can change their college in between their UG or PG course without written permission from GNDU.
- Rule for compartment candidates : In case a student is placed under compartment in any semester, she is not eligible to take admission in the same semester again unless she opts for another stream.

Eligibility for appearing in University Exams.

- Compulsory for all students to clear Mid Semester Tests(MSTs)
- To secure at least 20% marks in each paper and at least 25% marks in aggregate.
- Absence in MSTs due to any reason makes you liable to pay fine as decided by the committee.
- At least 75% attendance is compulsory.
- Those who fail to clear MSTs will have to clear Special Eligibility test.
- In case of illness, leave application along with Medical Certificate should be submitted to the Registrar immediately or within three days after the exams are over. No leave application will be entertained thereafter.

Leave Rules

1. If a student remains absent for 15 days continuously without information/leave application, her name will be struck off from the College Rolls and she can continue her studies only with re-admission.
2. A student who avails Medical Leave is granted 25% lectures on this account. It is essential to submit the Medical Certificate.
3. In case of absence for a long period, the student will have to pay the fine as per norms.

Fine

- A student will be fined heavily for absence.
- In case a student is found bunking classes, a heavy fine will be imposed as per the discretion of the principal.
- Any student caught using Mobile Phone in college campus will be fined heavily
- Any Student found bringing any vehicle to college without paying parking fee will be fined heavily.

Identity Card and Library Pass-Book

Each student is issued an Identity Card and Library Pass-Book in the beginning of the session. The Students are required to be in possession of their identity card while in the college. If a student is found without it, disciplinary action will be taken. In case of loss of Identity Card, the student should get another card issued immediately with special charges.

Library Rules

1. Library remains open from 9.00 AM to 4.00 PM.
2. Only regular students and members of the staff can get books issued from the library.
3. Books are issued against Library Pass-Book.
4. Under-graduate students can draw only two books at a time while Post-Graduate students can draw up to four books.

5. Text books can be retained for 14 days. If need be, the students and the staff can be asked to return the books at any time.
6. A fine of Rupee 1/- per daily will be charged if the books are not returned in time.
7. Poor students may keep the text books for the whole year which are issued from the College Book Bank with sanction of the Principal.
8. Books may be re-issued.
9. Reference books will not be issued.
10. Students will have to replace the books or pay three times of their price if the books are lost or damaged.
11. If a student loses a book, the matter should be immediately reported to the librarian.
12. In case of theft of book/books from the library, the student may face expulsion from the college.
13. Library Pass-Book and Identity Card are mandatory in the library and at the time of clearance for Roll Nos.
14. Photographs are compulsory for all Library Pass-Books.
15. In case of loss of original Library pass-book, a new pass book can be issued on payment of Rs.100/-
16. The student must keep their shoes and bags in the racks before entering the Library.

Govt. Scholarships for Schedule Castes/Scheduled Tribes/ Backward classes

Post Matric scholarship is available to Scheduled Caste Students whose Parents'/Guardians' income from all sources does not exceed Rs. 2.5 Lakhs and does not exceed Rs. 1 Lakh Per Annum for B.C. However, an income declaration by the self-employed parents/guardians stating definite income from all sources by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper, duly attested by Executive Magistrate is required. Employed parents/guardians are required to obtain income certificate from their employer and for additional income from other sources they would furnish declaration by way of an affidavit on one-judicial stamp paper duly attested by Executive Magistrate. Students/Parents/Guardians will be solely responsible for any false information given in the Affidavit and Form. As per Direction of Public Instructions (Colleges) Pb. Scholarship Branch Memo No. 270/21/C/14/2014 dt. The amount of scholarship to SC/BC student is transferred directly to the Adhar Card linked bank account of the beneficiaries from session 2020-21.

Important Note:

It is a responsibility of the students to apply online for SC/BC scholarship. For this, they may consult the concerned website www.punjabsscholarships.gov.in If a student fails to apply online on the above website, the college will not be responsible for any delay/failure in this regard. There is a committee of Senior teachers to deal with any grievances of students regarding Post Matric Scholarship.

Glimpses of College Infrastructure

B.K. Sardana Memorial Auditorium

With the Seating Capacity of 800, artistically designed auditorium, serves the purpose of hosting assemblies, Seminars, various functions-academic as well as cultural-that boost the morale of all those who wish to exhibit their talent. It has a balcony that gives it a splendid theater-like look. It is the most sought after venue for major functions organized by the local administration.



Language Lab

In order to make students proficient in the use of English language, coupled with correct pronunciation, improved phonetic skills and understanding of different accents, the language lab has been updated and upgraded. It offers the students an opportunity to learn English in an exciting and vibrant environment.

Science Block

There are well-equipped, well-furnished and updated laboratories in Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Bio-Technology, Optics and Electronics to delve deep into the mysteries of science. These labs facilitate the students to discover practically the wonders of science. A characteristic feature of this block is the botanical garden with rare species of hydrophytic, xerophytes (desert) amphibious (land and water) mesophytic (Moderate) and bonsai (miniature) plants which help the students gain practical knowledge and develop research aptitude.



I.T. Block

An extensive and in-depth knowledge of Information Technology (IT) has become indispensable in the contemporary educational and vocational scenario. The college possesses 8 computer labs with 2 mbps leased line for high-speed internet connectivity. To apprise the students of the configuration of a computer and the functioning of its various parts, a hardware display unit has also been set up.

Home Science & Fashion Designing Wing

The hither to domestic skill-oriented study of Home Science has broadened its ambit to include Home Management, Child Care, Clothing, Textile, Fashion Designing and Computer Aided Designing. The hi-tech labs help girls become self-reliant and confident home managers and entrepreneurs. A healthy family ecosystem is at the core of this education, promoting efficient and scientific use of resources.



Stress Management Lab

The stress management lab is helpful in providing personal guidance and expert professional counselling, along with imparting training in behavioral and relaxation techniques. The lab is valuable in giving personalized support and guidance for attitudinal shift among the students so they are better equipped to cope with stress in life.

Audio-Visual Lab

The Audio-Visual lab facilitates the creative use of animation, colour, Music Sound and Visual Graphics with latest technological aids to vitalize the existing academic scene making the process of teaching-learning interesting and interactive.





Economics and Business Management Lab

To hone multiple skills in statistics, finance, accounting and management, the Economics and Business Management lab has been upgraded which provides the much-needed exposure about the contemporary business scenario. The lab is helpful in organizing student oriented activities viz. guest lectures, mock events, case studies and presentations using new software.

Cosmetology Block

A well-furnished aesthetically designed cosmetology block with modern facilities helps the students learn the use of latest beauty gadgets and products and hone their skills in personal grooming hair and skin care, makeup techniques and the finesse of beauty culture. It has two different labs for hair treatment and skin care.



Fine Arts Lab.

An aesthetically designed Fine Arts Lab makes the students learn the positive use of latest technological advancements in the field of art and help them learn the finer nuances of Painting, Collage making, Clay modeling and a host of other artistic activities. Various workshops on oil painting, clay modeling are held in this lab.

Music Department

In order to create awareness and generate love for performing arts among students, an independent, airy and spacious wing comprising three rooms has been constructed for the department of Music & Dance. The Department remains vibrant with musical strains (vocal and Instrumentals) and dance beats throughout the year.



Cafeteria

The in-campus cafeteria provides healthy and hygienic food catering to all tastes. This 'friends and food zone' is the space for fun and frolic as well as rest and relaxation. Keeping in view the health of the students, traditional and healthy food is served in the cafeteria and pure filtered water is also made available here.

Stadium

A venue for the sporting events, the open air stadium is located at the center of college premises. The peripheral green lawns add to splendor and charm of the whole arena. Various college functions are also organized in this stadium. A Basket Ball court has been made available for players and a separate platform has been built for sports activities like Boxing, Taekwondo and Wushu martial arts.



Hostel

The comfortable, secure and spacious college hostel is a home away from home for the students coming from outside Phagwara. It has a decent study environment along with facilities for recreation. The hostel has all basic amenities, helping students grow individually as well as collectively by inculcating in them the spirit of camaraderie and dignity.

Library

Built in 5000, sq. feet and with a seating capacity of 250 persons, a regularly updated, well stocked, computerized hybrid library-a reader's paradise, provides congenial and solemn atmosphere for the students as well as the faculty. The Library provides the students with the facility of internet surfing It houses numerous reference books, encyclopedias, journals in various subjects and languages coupled with extensive reading material. Separate cabins have been provided to the students pursuing higher studies. Various text-related CD's are also available for the avid learners. An esteemed software is running efficiently to automate various library-related functions and activities. In addition to this, the college is a member of NLIST by INFLIBNET through which students can have access to e-books and e-journals.



Important Information for Students

Note

- All fees and dues must be paid according to the schedule given by the office, failing which a fine of rupees 10/- per day will be charged or the name may be struck off from the college roll.
- A student who is absent or is on leave from the college must arrange to pay the fee on due date.
- Fee and charges once deposited will not be refunded.
- **Non recognized boards/Universities etc.**
Students who have passed their lower examination from any Board/University not recognised by GNDU/UGC/ Government of India, shall not be eligible for admission in the college (as available on the GNDU/ UGC/ GOI websites).

Documents to be attached with Admission Form for Admission in 1st September of an Course

- I. Attested copy of certificate of previous Board/ University examination passed.
- II. Character certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
- III. DMC bearing University/ Board Registration Number.
- IV. Matriculation / Senior Secondary Certificate of the Board.
- V. Proof of Date of Birth.
- VI. Copy of Aadhar Card.
- VII. For Online Registration – Email id, 2 Photographs and 2 Mobile Phone Numbers are required.

Conditions for Promotion to Next Semester

- I. Course having two semester duration:
 - a) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester.
 - b) In case a student fails to pass all the courses/ papers within a period of two semesters (One Year), she shall be given two more consecutive semesters to pass.
- II. Course having four semester duration:
 - a) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester.
 - b) However the student shall be promoted to the third semester only if she has passed at least 40% courses/papers of the first two semesters.
 - c) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from third semester to fourth semester.
 - d) In case a student fails to pass all Courses/Papers within a period of four semesters(2 years) he/she shall be given four consecutive semesters to pass.
- III. Courses having six semester duration:
 - a) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester.
 - b) However the student shall be promoted to the third semester only if she has passed at least 40% courses/papers of the first two semesters.
 - c) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from third semester to fourth semester.
 - d) However the student shall be promoted to the third semester only if she has passed at least 40% courses/papers of the first four semesters.
 - e) The student shall be promoted to sixth semester only if she has passed all the papers of the first semester. After a period of six semesters the student shall be given a period of two consecutive years to pass.

Special Note for Reappear Candidates

If the title or subtitle is changed then the Reappear Candidates shall be allowed to appear as per their old syllabus and if there is no change in the title or subtitle of the subject and only some changes are made in the contents of the syllabus then all students will have to appear as per current (New) syllabus

CODE OF CONDUCT

College Assembly is a regular feature in which the attendance of all the students and teachers is compulsory.

- Only parents will be allowed to meet the students during college hours (only in case of emergency)
- In compliance with the orders of Hon 'ble Supreme Court, our college does not allow/ tolerate any ragging of the students in the college campus as it is a crime and should not be allowed to affect the students.

- No one is allowed to leave the college campus before 1.30 p.m,
- I-Card of students is a very important document which must be produced at the time of issuing of Roll No. slip.
- No student is allowed to use mobile phone unless it is an emergency.
- Students themselves are responsible for the safety of their belongings. The college will not be responsible if any student loses her mobile or any other expensive item in college.

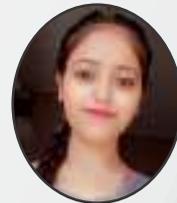
